Medical Facility in Santa Cruz, CA

Chandra Cerrito / Art Advisors had the pleasure of working with our longtime client, a national healthcare provider, and their design team to help develop a comprehensive art program that spans two floors in a shared, mixed-use medical building in Santa Cruz. The client was looking to reflect Santa Cruz, purchasing artworks by artists working in—or with strong ties to—the region.

Multiple artworks reflect the "feel" of the city through themes of environmentalism, local attractions, and the city's architecture. The carefully selected works are uplifting as well as calming while incorporating a full-spectrum of color.

Wave by local artist Laura Beach (above) is one of three super-graphics for the program. This installation was created from a limited edition woodcut in order to assist in wayfinding for the second floor lobby.



Lea de Wit, Let your spirit fly (2022). Hand-blown glass.

A hand-blown glass work by Lea de Wit, entitled *Let your spirit fly,* draws on the local fauna found within Santa Cruz. This custom bird installation is mounted behind the reception desk.



Jenni Ward, Marine Drifters (2022). Ceramic.

Depicting Santa Cruz's coastline, a ceramic triptych by Jenni Ward hangs above the office spaces in the building. Inspired by biological forms with a particular focus on structures, Ward connects to her environment to create abstract interpretations of forms through thoughtfully crafted sculptures.

A super-graphic by Erika Perloff and a repurposed marine rope piece by Ethan Estess, who is also a marine biologist, can be found on the fifth floor as well.




Rhianna Hurt, Wall Flowers (2020). Acrylic and mixed media on Yupo, watercolor paper, and photo film.

The collection also includes a series by Rhianna Hurt, on display in a stunning installation that graces the hallway. *Wall Flowers* is made from acrylic and mixed media on Yupo, watercolor paper, and photo film.

Together, these dynamic, dimensional works aid patient way-finding, create visual interest for wait areas, and demarcate public space from department interiors.

Technology Company Mass Timber Office Building Sunnyvale, CA

Chandra Cerrito / Art Advisors is honored to have worked with a wonderful team from a global computer technology company to provide public art at their new office building in Sunnyvale. Our team aided the creation of an art plan, led the artist selection, facilitated conceptual design, and managed the City approval process. Unique factors relating to the project site and architecture were starting points when art possibilities were considered. The mass timber construction of this beautiful building is on the leading forefront of sustainable design and is something to be celebrated. As the prior headquarters of the



infamous video game developer Atari, the site has historical significance, is a cultural touchstone for early video gamers, and carries personal meaning for many in the computer technology industry.

Michael Whiting, an artist who has been exploring the aesthetics of early video gaming for decades, was a perfect match for this project. Whiting's painted metal sculptures are pared-down representational forms that appear pixelated, referencing both Minimalism and the simplified video game depictions of the late 1970's and 1980's. For Mass Timber, Whiting was inspired by the site's connection to Atari as well as its current use as an office for an innovative technology company. His *Mothership* presents a flying saucer hovering on a beam, with colors that directly reference the interior design of the original Atari building. This enchanting, beautifully crafted artwork recalls the past with nostalgia and envisions the future with optimism.


