### Public Art Viamonte Walnut Creek









Congratulations to **Norie Sato** and **Nicky Statius**, who recently completed installations of site-specific artworks at Viamonte, a beautiful new senior living development in Walnut Creek.

Since 2015, CC/AA has been working with the development and design team to create a public art program, select artists, obtain City approvals, and oversee artwork integration and installation.

In the Fold, a sculptural fence by Sato, separates the project's courtyard from an adjacent public park. *Baskets* by Statius is comprised of four luminous sculptures that greet residents, visitors and passersby at the building's entrance. Details are shown.

### Information Technology Building Pleasanton

For the past five years, CC/AA has had the pleasure of providing art services for a large client as they have been renovating so far a total of eight floors of their Information Technology building. CC/AA has installed more than 110 engaging artworks throughout the building for the enjoyment of the tech employees, the executives, and their visitors.



For example, in several conference room areas are various original pieces including unique works on paper by Mitra Fabian. Fabian's use of circuit board elements to make biomorphic shapes incorporates the tiniest materials commonly found in an IT office environment. Refined architectural features are found on every floor and the interiors are complemented by processoriented artworks such as the intricately hand cut mixed media work by Christine Meuris and the brightly patterned paintings by Uma lyli. For the employee hubs, CC/AA arranged for artists to create customized three-dimensional signature pieces, such as the wire spoke pieces by Mikey Kelly, or the painting construction by Connie Goldman. The largest work in the building is a spectacular art installation by Klari Reis,

which brings a cool and uplifting vibe to a cluster of open workspaces.

#### Fertility Clinic Fremont

CC/AA worked with the design team at this IVF Clinic to seek artwork with a sense of warmth, softness and sophistication. Supergraphic images of blooming trees by **Byron Jorjorian** wrap inward or outward facing corners of exam rooms. The five exam rooms have three unique blossoming images creating variety. The artist fine-tuned to be sure the greens did not clash with the accent chairs in exam rooms.





Two glass pieces by Jenn Shifflet and an oil painting also by Jenn Shifflet are placed in the reception/wait areas over guest seating, and complement the soft pinks and wood tones in the interior finishes.
